

Corgi Bulldozers

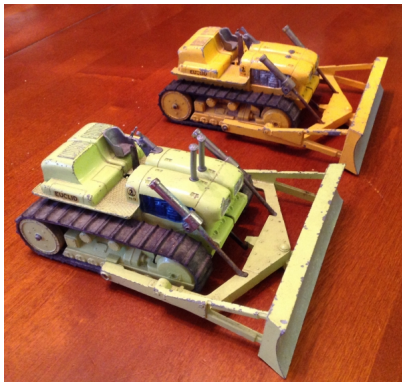

I will quote the Great Book of Corgi for you.

#1102 Euclid TC 12 Tractor with Dozer Blade, Issued in 1958 and with drawn in 1963 Scale 1:41. Sold in Yellow but also in Lime Green. Sold - 136,000

#1107 Euclid Tractor with Dozer Blade, Issued 1963, with drawn 1966 Came in Yellow and also in lime green, Same info as above but only sold 80,000 units.

Difference being the operating mechanism for the blade lifting and lowering and the driver figure were added.

Hope that clears up which came first, both, just depends on when it was put to market and there is no information on the color change dates that I can find.

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
